# Supermarket wants earlier delivery times

BUDGET supermarket Aldi want permission to have earlier deliveries on Sundays and bank holidays in Ross-on-Wye.

The Brookend Street store is currently allowed to receive deliveries between 7am and 9pm from Monday to Saturdays.

But on Sundays, bank and public holidays it's restricted to deliveries from 9am to 6pm – they are now asking for permission for deliveries from 7am on those days.

Planning consultant Lloyd Collins said the store was successful but needed to adapt.

"In a competitive market place, Aldi must evolve to meet consumer demand.

"Given the change in the pattern of retailing over time and the desire for customers to purchase fresh produce with maximum produce life, this requires a flexible system of stock management

and distribution.

"The sheer volume of stock that the store handles means that Aldi needs to be as efficient as possible at restocking when the store is at its quietest."

Residents have until March 5th to comment on the proposals.



# Have your say on Walford NDP

WALFORD Neighbourhood Development Plan is at the stage where the steering group needs input from local residents. They want people's opinions on

1. The proposed vision and objectives for our NDP.

2. The criteria for selecting sites for future development.

3. Specific items that

you think are special to this Parish and deserve protecting, such as a piece of woodland, a view, or a building.

They urge people to attend one of the two 'drop-in' sessions that will be held on Saturday, February 22nd at Walford Village Hall or Saturday, February 29th at Bishopswood Village Hall, between 10:00am and

2:00pm. It will take 30-45 minutes to input answers to all the questions, but members of the NDP steering group will be on hand to assist.

The steering group believes that having their own NDP will enable the communities of the parish to play a much stronger role in saying where new developments are sited,

and shaping the neighbourhood in which they live and work. Once adopted, the NDP will be used alongside national and county policies by the planning authority when making decisions.
